

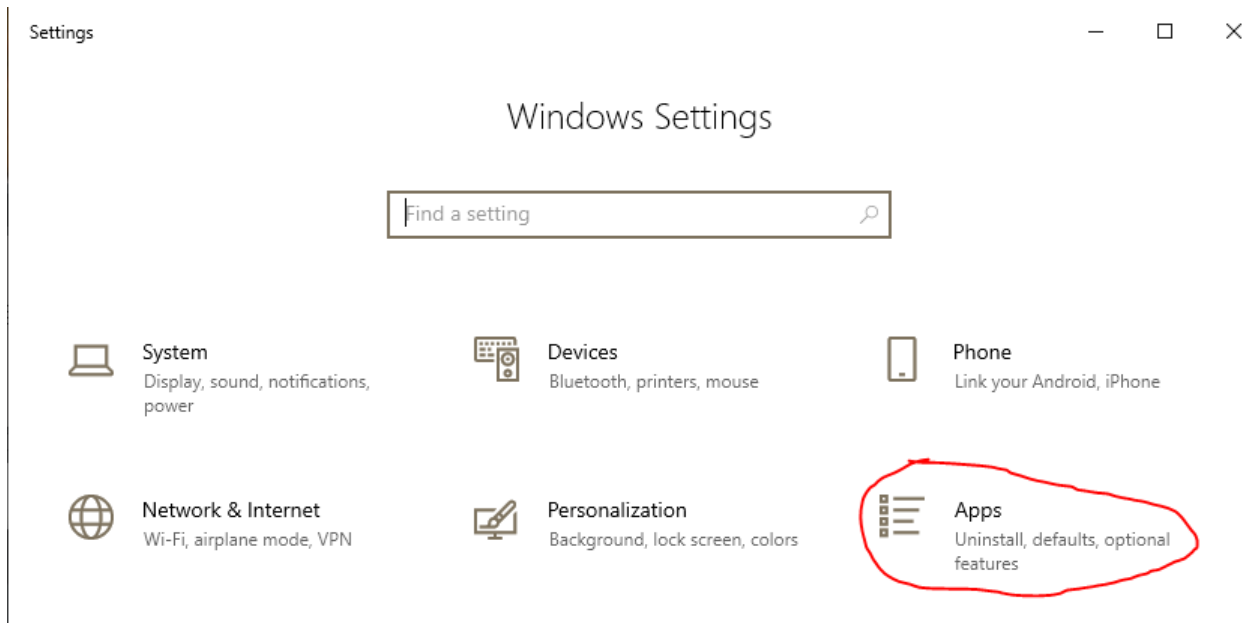

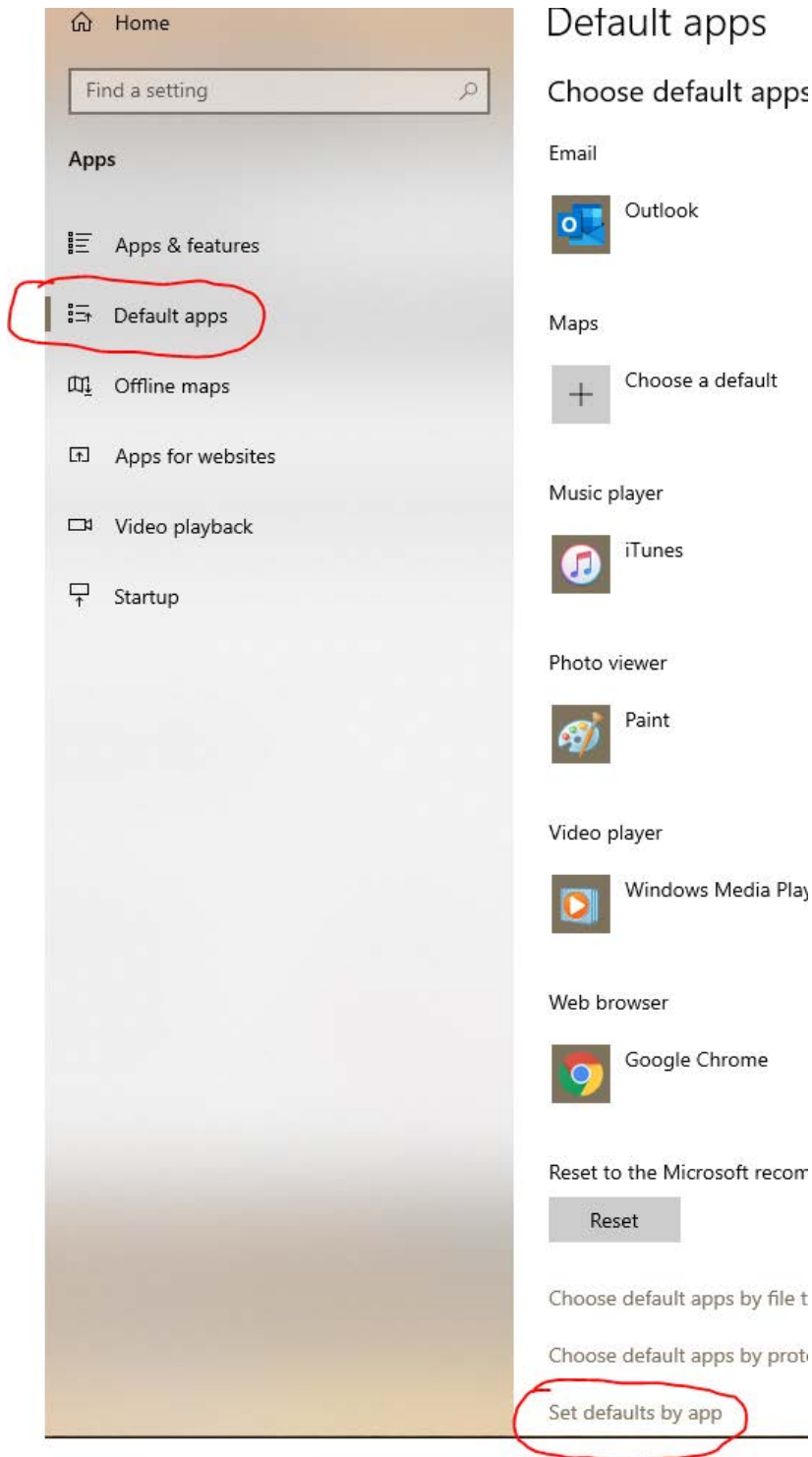
### 2. Click on the Start icon and then “Settings”



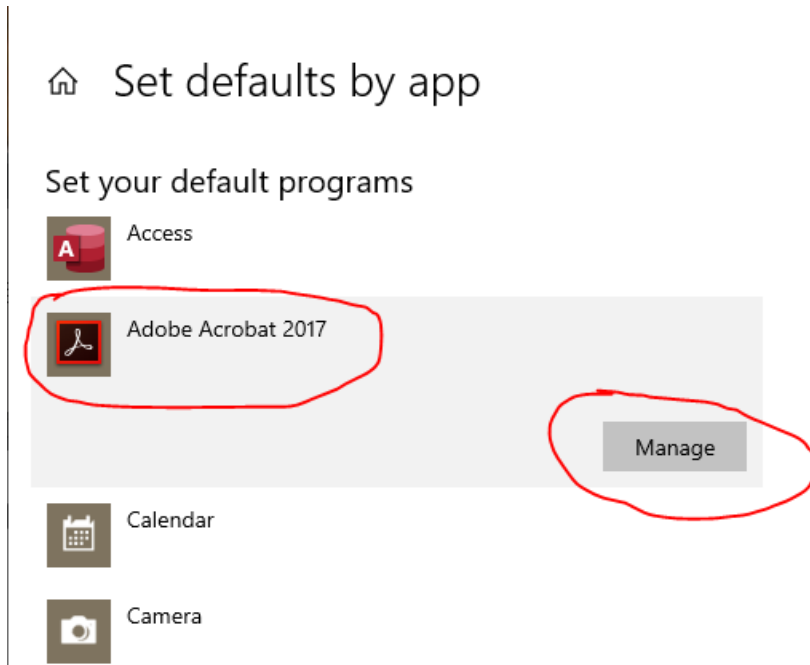
### 3. Click on “Apps”
