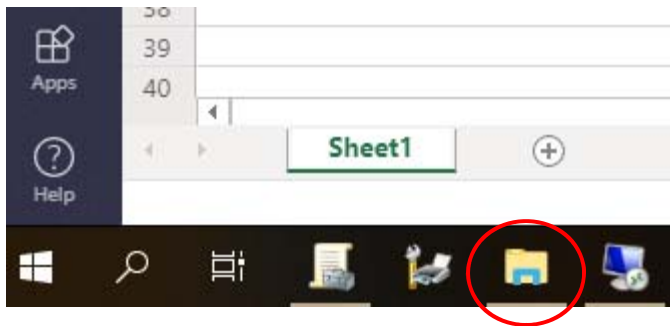
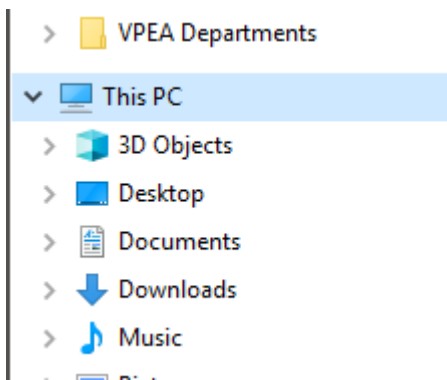


Map Network Drive From PC

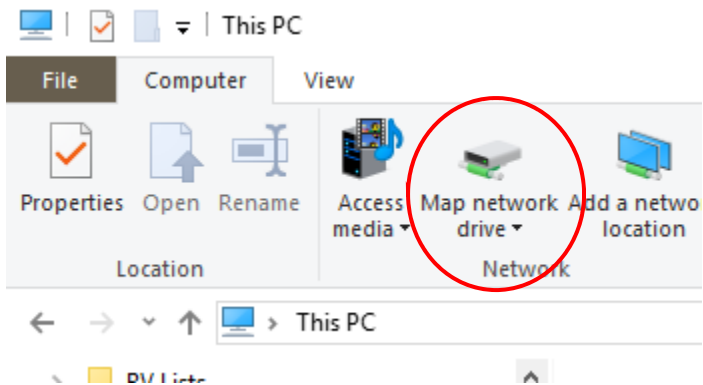
1. Open "File Explorer" It's usually available as the little yellow folder icon on your taskbar



2. Click on "This PC"



3. In the ribbon of File Explorer, click on "Map network drive"



4. This will open a dialog box.
 - a. From the drop down menu next to “Drive” select any available letter. It doesn’t matter which one as long as it isn’t already in use
 - b. In the box next to “Folder” enter the folder you want to connect to. The common standard VPEA folders are. Enter the one you need
 - i. \\csunts.acns.colostate.edu\ea_common
 - ii. \\csunts.acns.colostate.edu\adcommon
 - iii. \\csunts.acns.colostate.edu\ea_tac
 - iv. \\csunts.acns.colostate.edu\ea_vpea
 - v. \\csunts.acns.colostate.edu\ea_registrar
 - vi. \\csunts.acns.colostate.edu\ea_sfs
 - c. Click on “Reconnect at sign-in”
 - d. Click on “Connect using different credentials”
 - e. Click “Finish”
